

## WHAT CHURCH COUNCILS DO!

**D**o you know what the National Council of Churches is? Do you know what the World Council of Churches is? Do you know what either of those bodies does? Or is your knowledge of the Body of Christ across denominational lines limited to hot ticket items like the arguments over “tongues,” whether Christians should be watching Harry Potter, homosexuality and abortion?

Most Christians sitting in their pews have no concept whatsoever as to what the various Councils of Churches do, in spite of the fact that their work is absolutely invaluable and smack dab in the middle of the agenda of Jesus Christ. Trinity United Church of Christ and the denomination (the United Church of Christ) are a part of these Councils, and I thought that you, our members (and visitors) just might want to see a glimpse of some of their important work that goes far beyond the “controversial” issues that the media loves to highlight.

Below is a portion of an article about the Wisconsin Council of Churches written by my mentor and Dr. Julia Speller’s advisor. Read! Learn! and Rejoice! Somebody is trying to be the church after “having” church on Sundays.



### REPORT FROM WISCONSIN

Last month, I spent a page sighting activities in mainline Protestant bodies as exemplified in a large congregation, and extrapolating on the basis of that to smaller ones everywhere (“Mainline Mission,” June 4). Today I focus on a Council of Churches in order to look at councils of churches...

Now, in the nature of things, such councils [as the Wisconsin Council of Churches, the National Council of Churches and the World Council of Churches] are always understaffed, under-budgeted, and under-noticed,

but they coordinate and/or are the pulse of many things that go on in the putatively languishing mainline. They are under-noticed in part because the mainline [churches like Trinity UCC and the mainline denominations like the UCC are]...not adept at or focused on the media. They make news this century mainly because they are torn over the issue of homosexuality.

So what goes on, beyond the Forum — [the annual summer gathering of the Wisconsin Council of Churches]? To those who think

mainliners are wishy-washy, one should point out that its website identifies the Wisconsin Council as a collection of churches which proclaim the Triune God and redemption in Jesus Christ. It helps equip the “missional church.”

On its agenda are topics like hunger, health care, housing, nonviolence, poverty, and other issues which their leaders are told should not be their focus the way homosexuality and abortion are, but which they find hard to avoid because of the hundreds of pages in their Bibles which do address such issues.

And they announce some strong “Bible-believing topics,” such as Susan Briehl’s workshops on the Gospel of John at three sites, and workshops by James Bailey on the Gospel of Matthew.

There are churchly concerns, such as lay

ministry and relationships among religions and cultures, and some probing of church and state issues, with one workshop on advocacy, whose singularity suggests that it’s not an overdone topic.

Note that this Illinoisan is not “promoting” Wisconsin. Hit the link provided in the “References” below, and you will find that most of the other forty-nine states have analogous agencies, and there are hundreds of non-state bases as well. They may seem to fly “under the radar” of the media, but they help fly reconnaissance and other missions whose beneficiaries are well aware of them.

## A FRESH VIEW OF THE PALESTINIAN STRUGGLE

Hamas' stand

An official of the movement describes its goals for all of Palestine.

DAMASCUS, SYRIA – HAMAS' RESCUE of a BBC journalist from his captors in Gaza last week was surely cause for rejoicing. But I want to be clear about one thing: We did not deliver up Alan Johnston as some obsequious boon to Western powers.

It was done as part of our effort to secure Gaza from the lawlessness of militias and violence, no matter what the source. Gaza will be calm and under the rule of law - a place where all journalists, foreigners and guests of the Palestinian people will be treated with dignity. Hamas has never supported attacks on Westerners, as even our harshest critics will concede; our struggle has always been focused on the occupier and our legal resistance to it — a right of occupied people that is explicitly supported by the Fourth Geneva Convention.

Yet our movement is continually linked by President Bush and Israeli Prime Minister Ehud Olmert to ideologies that they know full well we do not follow, such as the agenda of Al Qaeda and its adherents. But we are not part of a broader war. Our resistance struggle is no one's proxy, although we welcome the support of people everywhere for justice in Palestine.

The American efforts to negate the will of the Palestinian electorate by destroying our fledgling government have not succeeded - rather, the U.S.-assisted Fatah coup has only multiplied the problems of Washington's "two-state solution."

Mr. Bush has for the moment found a pliant friend in Abu Mazen, a "moderate" in the American view but one who cannot seriously expect to command confidence in the streets of Gaza or the West Bank after having taken American arms and Israeli support to depose the elected government by force. We deplore the current prognosticating over "Fatah-land" versus "Hamastan." In the end, there can be only one Palestinian state.

But what of the characterization by the West of our movement as beyond the pale of civilized discourse? Our "militant" stance cannot by itself be the disqualifying factor, as many armed struggles have historically resulted in a place at the table of nations. Nor can any deny the reasonableness of our fight against the occupation and the right of Palestinians to have dignity, justice and self-rule.

Yet in my many years of keeping an open mind to all sides of the Palestine question - including those I spent in an American prison, awaiting Israeli "justice" — I am forever asked to concede the recognition of Israel's putative "right to exist" as a necessary precondition to discussing grievances, and to renounce positions found in the Islamic Resistance Movement's charter of 1988, an essentially revolutionary document born of the intolerable conditions under occupation more than 20 years ago.

The sticking point of “recognition” has been used as a litmus test to judge Palestinians. Yet as I have said before, a state may have a right to exist, but not absolutely at the expense of other states, or more important, at the expense of millions of human individuals and their rights to justice. Why should anyone concede Israel’s “right” to exist, when it has never even acknowledged the foundational crimes of murder and ethnic cleansing by means of which Israel took our towns and villages, our farms and orchards, and made us a nation of refugees?

Why should any Palestinian “recognize” the monstrous crime carried out by Israel’s founders and continued by its deformed modern apartheid state, while he or she lives 10 to a room in a cinderblock, tin-roof United Nations hut? These are not abstract questions, and it is not rejectionist simply because we have refused to abandon the victims of 1948 and their descendants.

As for the 1988 charter, if every state or movement were to be judged solely by its foundational, revolutionary documents or the ideas of its progenitors, there would be a good deal to answer for on all sides. The American Declaration of Independence, with its self-evident truth of equality, simply did not countenance (at least, not in the minds of most of its illustrious signatories) any such status for the 700,000 African slaves at that time; nor did the Constitution avoid codifying slavery as an institution, counting “other persons” as three-fifths of a man. Israel, which has never formally adopted a constitution of its own but rather operates through the slow accretion of Basic Laws, declares itself explicitly to be a state for the Jews, conferring privileged status based on faith in a land where millions

of occupants are Arabs, Muslims and Christians.

The writings of Israel’s “founders” — from Herzl to Jabotinsky to Ben Gurion — make repeated calls for the destruction of Palestine’s non-Jewish inhabitants: “We must expel the Arabs and take their places.” A number of political parties today control blocs in the Israeli Knesset, while advocating for the expulsion of Arab citizens from Israel and the rest of Palestine, envisioning a single Jewish state from the Jordan to the sea. Yet I hear no clamor in the international community for Israel to repudiate these words as a necessary precondition for any discourse whatsoever. The double standard, as always, is in effect for Palestinians.

I, for one, do not trouble myself over “recognizing” Israel’s right to exist — this is not, after all, an epistemological problem; Israel does exist, as any Rafah boy in a hospital bed, with IDF shrapnel in his torso, can tell you. This dance of mutual rejection is a mere distraction when so many are dying or have lived as prisoners for two generations in refugee camps. As I write these words, Israeli forays into Gaza have killed another 15 people, including a child. Who but a Jacobin dares to discuss the “rights” of nations in the face of such relentless state violence against an occupied population?

I look forward to the day when Israel can say to me, and millions of other Palestinians: “Here, here is your family’s house by the sea, here are your lemon trees, the olive grove your father tended: Come home and be whole again.” Then we can speak of a future together.

On Tuesday, August 7, at 11:00 a.m. (CST), the National Action Network's Decency Initiative will take to the streets in 20 cities, including Chicago, in an effort to mound public pressure on the music industry to adopt a universal standard of respect for all people.

Since April, the Decency Initiative, under the leadership of Reverend Al Sharpton and Tamika Mallory, and in collaboration with dozens of activists across the nation, has demanded that the music recording industry eliminate the use of the offensive "n," "b," and "h" words in recordings. Because no other ethnic group is subjected to denigration for profit by the music industry, the Decency Initiative will continue to demand a universal standard of respect, particularly for all women and African Americans.

Protests and press conferences will take place outside the offices of major music distributors that distribute this offensive music within our communities. The protests will be multicultural and will include all age groups. We invite all women and men (especially leaders and students), from all facets of the community to join us. We will stand united in defense of decency, and protest the use of public airwaves to promote disrespect. This gathering is just the beginning of a national movement to achieve this end.

## STOP PACE!

Hearings have begun concerning service cuts and fare increases on the Pace Bus line, which will significantly affect the Chicago area's disabled paratransit riders. Some changes being discussed include:

- Discontinue disabled passengers from making same-day changes to their destinations
- Discontinue allowing same-day changes to pick-up times and drop-offs
- Discontinue door-to-door service (Drivers not allowed to assist riders)
- Discontinue weekend service
- Splitting routes into various regions, causing disabled riders to transfer from one bus

- Significant increase in fare (increases to \$4.00 one way and \$8.00 round trip)
- Discontinue ADA monthly passes.

**A**fter many years of trying to be faithful in ministry to our television viewing audience we have had to make a financial decision because of the lack of funds. We would rather lose the viewing audience who watches us on Sunday nights than lose staff!

We do not have the money to stay on WJYS any longer. When the decision was made, as to whether or not we should come off of WJYS or fire staff, we decided (as we always do) to make our choice in light of the human costs and the potential loss to families of income. We would rather lose television viewers than lose staff members who depend on their income to support their families.

Staying on WJYS is costing our congregation a tremendous amount of money. We are losing in excess of \$14,000.00 a month! Our television viewers do not support us financially. Our television viewers do not buy tapes. Our television viewers do not send donations and we pay for that WJYS airtime entirely out of our church offerings!

We cannot afford to be on WJYS and on national television at the same time. We will remain on national television and we can be seen (videotaped or TiVo'd) every Sunday morning at six-thirty in the morning Central Standard Time.

We are on the only Black-owned national television cable channel in the country. We support Black businessmen and Black businesswomen and we will continue to support Cathy Hughes and TV One as we try to minister to our national television audience every Sunday morning.


Please alert all of your friends and family members who do not have Direct TV or TV One that they have from now until Sunday, July 29th to get it. That is if they want to continue to watch us on television!

# BY-LAWS

## RECOMMENDED CHANGES TO THE BY-LAWS, AS SUGGESTED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION MINISTRY

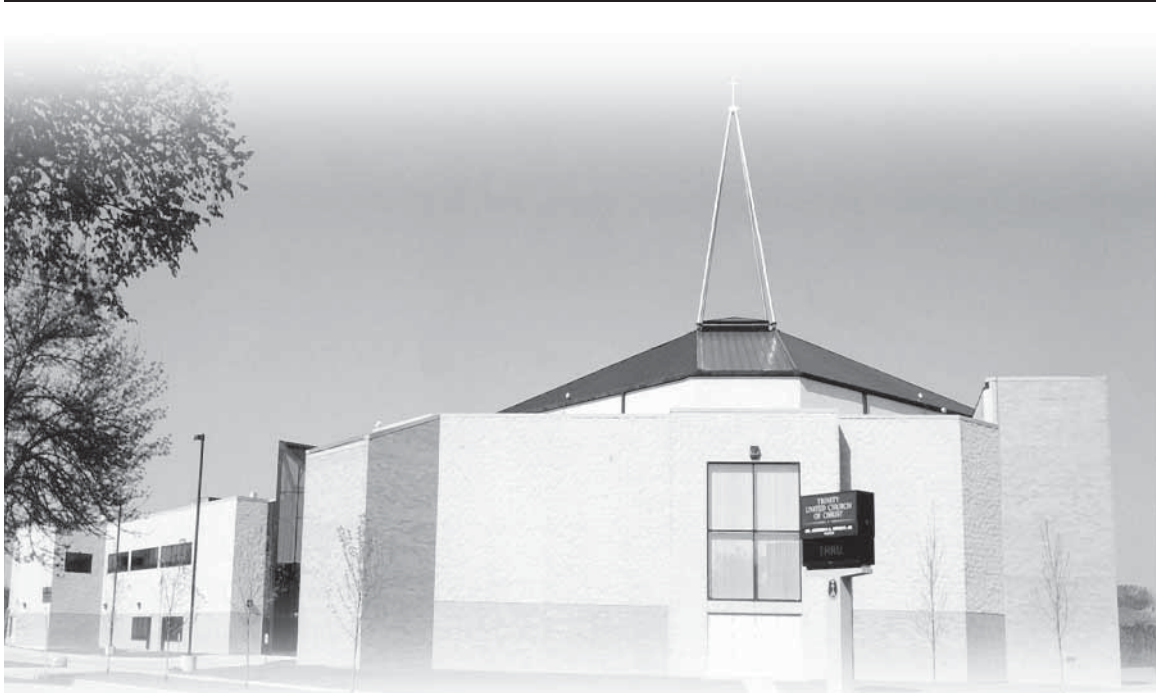
### Section 8 Christian Education Ministry B. Scope of Ministry and Responsibilities

- (1) The Christian Education Ministry, in consultation with the Pastor and his/her designate shall have as its scope of ministry, coordinating and monitoring the Christian Education focus **EMPHASIS** (from and African Centered perspective **AND CONSISTENT WITH THE BLACK VALUE SYSTEM**) of each volunteer ministry, the teaching ministries; the youth and young adult ministries and other related Christian Education endeavors of members of the congregation. The Christian Education Ministry shall be actively involved in the life of the Christian Education programs and of the entire Church through the following responsibilities listed in the succeeding subsections.
- (3) The Christian Education Ministry shall further support the overall ministry of the Trinity United Church of Christ, from an African Centered Perspective (**AND CONSISTENT WITH THE BLACK VALUE SYSTEM**) as interpreted and directed by the Pastor, by:
  - ~~(a) receiving instructions from the Pastor related to the Christian Education Ministry of the church;~~
  - (a) ON A QUARTERLY BASIS, TO ENSURE EACH VOLUNTEER MINISTRY IS ADHERING TO THE MISSION AND THE BLACK VALUE SYSTEM;**
  - ~~(c) engaging in strategic and long range planning for the overall Christian Education ministry of the Church;~~
  - (c) ENSURE EACH VOLUNTEER MINISTRY IS ADHERING TO THE MISSION OF TUCC AND THE BLACK VALUE SYSTEM;**
  - ~~(f) recommending personnel and staff needs as discerned through its relationships with various volunteer and teaching ministries;~~
- (4) ~~The Christian Education Ministry Shall has the responsibility of making policy and operational recommendations for the Department of Christian in consultation with the Pastor, and the Director of Christian Education, consistent with the overall ministry and mission of Trinity United Church of Christ.~~

### C. Organization of The Christian Education Ministry

- (a) The Christian Education Ministry shall elect its own officers to include, but not limited to a Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Recording Secretary, Treasurer ~~(as needed)~~, **AND** Chaplain. ~~(may be elected or appointed)~~. Appointed positions will include, but not be limited to Corresponding Secretary and Sergeant at Arms.



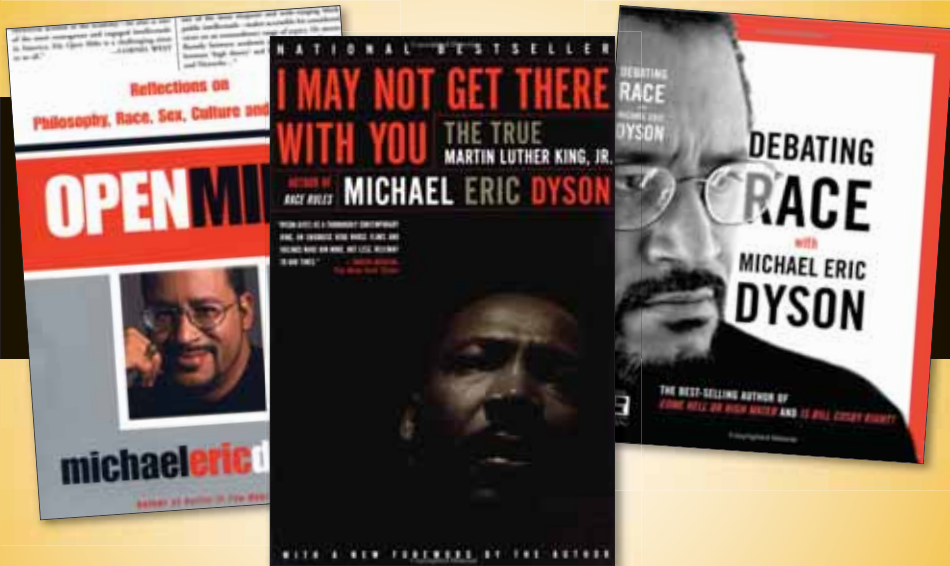

### *August*

**Isaiah 40:27** Why do you say, O Jacob, and complain, O Israel, “My way is hidden from the LORD; my cause is disregarded by my God”?

### *September*

**Isaiah 40:28** Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom.

### *October*

**Isaiah 40:29** He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak.

### *November*

**Isaiah 40:30** Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall;

### *December*

**Isaiah 40:31** But those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.
